On Monday, at Collective Worship, we looked at the significance of the poppy and why poppies are worn at this time of the year. We have continued our preparation for our special service this week by practising our peace related hymns. Over the holidays, further work was undertaken on the garden and, yesterday, all of the pebbles which have been decorated were transferred to the outdoor classroom ready to be stuck in place around one of the beds.
