

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Learning about caring for living things.
Addressing fears/ anxieties about animals and mini-beasts.
Sharing and taking turns to use limited equipment.
Developing self confidence/ self esteem by talking about activities.

Communication and Language

Extending vocabulary to reflect experiences/ our theme.
Asking questions related to animals and the things they see and do.
Key worker time each Monday, discussing the weekend's task.

Literacy

Drawing pictures of animals and describing them.
Making a poster regarding what animals need.
Practise name writing.
Guided reading - looking at books and how they are structured. Listening to a range of animal themed stories.
Phonics phase 1 and 2 continued.
Using and talking about non-fiction books related to animals.

Physical Development

Practise good personal hygiene routines.
Dough disco (using dough in different ways e.g. squeeze, roll, stretch), wriggle and write e.g. up and down, side to side, zig zag etc).
Moving imaginatively in PE.

You can help by:

Talking to your child about what they are doing at school.
Talking to your child about the different animals they have seen.
Looking at and enjoying books together.
Helping them to learn numbers by recognising the number, ordering them and also counting out objects to match the number.
Looking at the letters in their name, what does their name begin with.
