In English this term we will be looking at:

- "Bog Baby"- character and setting descriptions and designing our own Bog Baby.
- "Poles Apart" - linked to Geography; hot and cold places.
- We are also focusing on practising reading nonsense and real words ready for the phonics screening in June.
- Continuing to develop letters that are correctly formed and consistent in shape and size.



Our Science topic is Plants

We will:

- Know that flowering plants have roots, stems and leaves.
 - Recognise and name flowering plants.
 - Describe how a seed germinates and grows into a plant.
 - Describe the growth of a plant.
- Plan and carry out an investigation into what plants need to grow.
Recognise which foods come from plants.

In Maths this term we will be looking at:

- Number and place value
 - Multiplication and division.
 - Fractions
 - Geometry and position and direction
 - Time - o'clock and half past
- You can help your child by helping them learn how to tell the time.
Sharing amounts into equal groups.

Give a good reason for the views they have and the connections they make.
- ICT- We will be learning about animations.
- PE- Tennis, Athletics and preparing for Sports Day.
- Music- We will be exploring pitch.
