In English we will be...

...studying the book 'Holes' by Louis Sachar. We will be exploring persuasive and instructional texts detailing how to survive at 'Camp Green Lake'. This text will allow us to learn new grammatical structures and help us to improve our writing skills, with particular focus placed on the use of sophisticated punctuation such as colon, semi-colon, brackets, dashes and commas. Throughout the topic, pupils will practise reading comprehension and continue to work on their personal English targets.

In Maths we will be...

...continuing to revise arithmetic using both mental and written methods; understanding reasoning problems and how to use a range of strategies to solve them; solving problems using data presented in bar graphs, tables and pie charts; understanding and converting between fractions, decimals and percentages; and exploring ratio and proportion.

Creative Curriculum: Mountains

In this topic we will be learning about the world's major mountain ranges, as well as how mountains are formed. Through detailed map-work, we will be exploring how UK mountains compare to the Andes and the Rockies. We will also discover how people and animals have adapted to live in mountainous environments. With reference to human and physical geographical features, children will also explain how a locality has changed over time.

Living things and their habitats: *We will understand the differences between the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird. We will also be able to describe the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals.*

Other learning topics will include:

French: Continuing to develop language skills through greetings, shopping, food and colours.

Computing: Coding, E-safety and digital literacy.
