Thank you to all the parents who have completed our E-safety and Remote Learning questionnaires. Based on your responses, I would like to share some resources that may be effective and supportive during lockdown for children in KS1 and EYFS.

Thinkyouknow, an educational organisation which protects children both online and offline, have produced a lot of age appropriate content on their website regarding staying safe online. Some of their tips for parents in KS1 and EYFS include:

- Explore together.
- Initiate (and continue) conversations about online safety and how to recognise things that make them feel uncomfortable.
- Help your child identify adults who can help.
- Be non-judgemental.
- Supervise your child while they're online.
- Talk to your child about how their online actions can affect others.
- Using child appropriate search engines - <https://primaryschoolict.com/>
- Parental controls.
