PE: This will be on Fridays at home and on Thursdays in school, so children of key workers in school will need to bring their kits on this day. We are going to be teaching volleyball for this unit with video demonstrations that can be practised at home either in the garden using a ball, or the home using a balloon.

Creative Curriculum: Year Six will be asking 'What Can We Do To Save Our Planet?' as part of a geography topic exploring humanity's impact upon the Earth. This will include exploring climate change and its causes alongside the effect it is having upon world biomes, and weather patterns as well as investigating the global distribution of resources with pupils recording their work in their scrapbooks in an exciting and engaging manner of their choice.

English: Each week, we will focus on a different story or short film as a writing and reading stimulus. During the week, we will practise a variety of key English skills, building up to a piece of writing. Mr VDG and Miss Brace are both recording themselves reading their class stories (the Chronicles of Narnia) and sharing those on the VLE every school day. It would be great if our pupils continued developing their love of reading through exploring a variety of books at home during lockdown and we are in the process of securing digital copies of a wide variety of books for children to access at home. Also, we would recommend continuing to use Spelling Frame each week as a means of developing a key life skill and will set a weekly spelling pattern to practise with links on the VLE English page.

Maths: Pupils will continue covering the Year 6 curriculum so that all children have been taught the full range of their age-related maths expectations. Online lessons will include a daily starter recapping previously taught calculations and concepts; a video lesson with differentiated activities; and a daily counting challenge. We also recommend pupils play maths games using <https://mathsframe.co.uk/> as a means of consolidating their understanding in a fun way.

Science: Our new topic this term is 'Light' - recognising that light appears to travel in straight lines, explaining that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye and explaining why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.

R.E.: We will be asking the big question 'What does it mean for Muslims to follow God?' Children will be exploring Islamic beliefs about God, the Prophet and the Holy Qur'an, describing ways in which the Five Pillars of Islam guide worship and Muslim living.

Computing: We will be exploring coding using Purple Mash to create our own games alongside continuing developing pupils' ability to represent their learning using a variety of programmes and tools.
